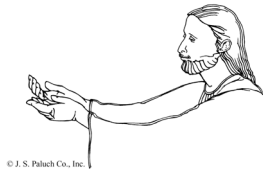

Part II: Labyrinth Prayer

At Our Lady of the Cape, we are very blessed to have a new labyrinth in our parish's prayer garden! We invite you to visit the prayer garden and consider prayerfully walking the labyrinth. We thank Joseph and Faith Buscone for giving this gift to the parish.

The labyrinth offers us a unique space for prayer, and labyrinth prayer is now enjoying a resurgence after fading for some years. Perhaps one of the reasons for its current increased popularity is that it is bodily prayer. Bodily prayer is simply prayer in which we involve our bodies. Whereas some kinds of prayer, such as the Rosary for example, typically involve quieting and subduing our bodies, bodily prayer such as that which takes place while walking a labyrinth, entails the participation of our bodies.

Why would we wish to have our bodies be part of our prayer? There are many reasons, but the most prominent are:

Sometimes we have difficulty focusing when our prayer is purely intellectual. Our minds can be in overdrive. Involving our bodies can be a way to help calm and quiet our minds of distractions so that we can better engage in our prayer time.

Because our bodies are gifts to us from God, we know that they are good and rightly enter into our relationships with God.

Jesus came to earth in a human body, confirming to us that the human body is innately good and holy.

Like all Catholic spiritual practices, labyrinth prayer can help us in the deepening of our faith. As Catholics, we are blessed with a rich spiritual tradition that offers us many ways to pray. Our prayer experiences enable us to encounter Jesus, to grow in relationship with Jesus, and to receive the fruits of prayer. These include peace, healing, transformation, wisdom, strength and comfort, among others. Further, a recent article in the Huffington Post entitled, *Why People Who Pray Are Healthier Than Those Who Don't* concluded that "What science can tell us is that people who pray and meditate tend to be statistically more healthy and live longer than those who do not."

Consider visiting the prayer garden and praying on our new labyrinth! Set aside some time to be spiritually refreshed. The labyrinth may be walked individually or in groups. Our first parish group labyrinth walk is planned for August 6th. The prayer garden and labyrinth will be blessed after the 10:00 AM Mass on August 6th. A short reception and group walk will take place after the blessing ceremony. Hope to see you there!
