41ST ANNUAL CANAL WALK FOR HAITI will be held on **Good Friday, April 19**, along the service road of the Cape Cod Canal in Buzzards Bay, Mass. For 41 years participants from Cape Cod and Eastern Massachusetts have been walking 10 km along this scenic route to raise funds and awareness of worthwhile humanitarian projects in Haiti sponsored by local organizations.

The walk begins at the Buzzards Bay railroad bridge parking lot at **9:00 a.m.**, rain or shine, and proceeds 5 km along the Army Corps of Engineers service road (no vehicular traffic) to the Herring Run Visitors Center. Hot and cold drinks, sandwiches, and fruit are available free of charge for walkers. Port-a-Potties are open for the convenience of walkers. The walk then continues back along the same route to the original starting location. Walkers are asked to secure pledges or donations from family and friends. **For Our Lady of the Cape walkers, make checks payable to: Our Lady of the Cape.** We invite anyone who wishes to participate in assisting our sisters and brothers in Haiti, to walk with us in solidarity with the Haitian people on **Good Friday, April 19**. Stations of the Cross pamphlets will be given to all walkers. Walkers are encouraged to read and meditate on each station in remembrance of the meaning of Good Friday. DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY is **April 28th**, the second Sunday of Easter. Our parish will be having a Divine Mercy Celebration once again, and all are welcome! Divine Mercy Sunday gives us the opportunity to receive and celebrate the merciful love of God as revealed in Jesus. Our celebration will take place as follows:

- 1:30 - 3:00 p.m.** Sacrament of Reconciliation
- 2:50 p.m.** Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament
- 3:00 p.m.** Chaplet of Divine Mercy in song, followed by Benediction, and then veneration of relic of St. Faustina

Come and join in this beautiful celebration of our merciful, loving God!

In preparation for the celebration, we will be praying the Novena to the Divine Mercy after the 8:00 a.m. weekday Masses during the week between Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday. This Novena begins on Good Friday and extends to Divine Mercy Sunday, and is comprised of an intercessory prayer and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Pamphlets with the prayers and Chaplet will be available in the church during Holy Week.

SHE WHO WEEPS

(Palm Sunday: Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11; Luke 22:14—23:56)

The outline of the Passion is the same in all four Gospels but there are details that are unique to each one. For example, Luke alone records Jesus' encounter with the weeping women on his way to Calvary. He tells them, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children." A similar painful image is used by Our Lady of La Salette: "Children under the age of seven will be seized with trembling and die in the arms of those who hold them."

Anyone who has lost a child can understand the weight of grief evoked by these words. At La Salette Mary weeps, in a sense, for herself and for her children, her people. Her tears are a source of consolation for us. They are also a renewed invitation to return to the Lord with all our heart.

I am reminded of other biblical texts: "No longer shall the sound of weeping be heard there, or the sound of crying. No longer shall there be in Jerusalem an infant who lives but a few days, nor anyone who does not live a full lifetime" (Isaiah 65:19-20); "He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away" (Revelation 21:4).

The old order of sin and death has been replaced by the new order of grace—of hope, of life, of love—by Jesus' death and resurrection.

Luke's Passion also includes three "last words" of Jesus not found in the other Gospels.

The first is: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." At La Salette, Our Lady makes us painfully aware of our offenses, but assures us that she pleads ceaselessly on our behalf.

The second is addressed to a confessed criminal: "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." The Beautiful Lady highlights the importance and the benefit of conversion.

And the third is: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." In encouraging us to pray, Mary teaches us to adopt Jesus' attitude of absolute trust.

None of these similarities should surprise us, coming from her who stood at the foot of the cross and wept over us at La Salette.
