MAKE HAND SANITIZER!



Making hand sanitizer is easy to do and only requires a few ingredients:

- 1) 2/3 Cup isopropyl or rubbing alcohol (99 percent alcohol volume)
- 2) 1/3 Cup aloe vera gel
- 3) optional: a few drops of an essential oil, such as tea tree oil, peppermint oil or lavender oil, or you can use lemon juice instead

- Make the hand sanitizer in a clean space. Wipe down countertops with a diluted bleach solution beforehand.
- Wash your hands thoroughly before making the hand sanitizer.
- Don't touch the mixture with your hands until it's ready for use.

Instructions

1. In a small bowl mix the rubbing alcohol and aloe vera gel together until well combined.
2. Optional: add in just a few drops of essential oil of your choice.

PUBLIC MASSES TO RESUME ON THE WEEKEND OF MAY 30th/31st

Following the guidelines given by Gov. Charlie Baker, the Most Reverend Edgar Da Cunha, Bishop of Fall River, has announced reopening of churches to resume public Masses under strict guidelines on the Feast of Pentecost which falls on the weekend of May 30th/31st.

- In preparation of re-opening the church and out of an abundance of caution, Masses at Our Lady of the Cape church are scheduled for 4:00PM on Saturday and Sunday at 10:00AM only. Daily Mass will be celebrated at 8:00AM. The Immaculate Conception Chapel will remain closed until further notice. The Saturday 4:00PM Mass will continue to be live-streamed and will be archived on our parish website (www.ourladyofthecape.org) for you to access anytime. Daily Mass will be celebrated for the public and will be livestreamed at 8:00AM from Our Lady of the Cape church.
- We are returning to our worship place in a time when coronavirus is still a threat. As we get adjusted to this "new normal" we all should be extra prudent and prepared in observing all necessary precautions to avoid contracting the virus while participating in a large public gathering.
- Following the Governor's ordinance, at Our Lady of the Cape we can accommodate only 340 people at each service. Prior to resuming Masses, the church will be prepared with signage to direct people. The aisles and pews will be marked to facilitate the observance of social distancing practices. **Seating will be on a first come first served basis. Not all pews of the church will be open for seating. Every other pew will be blocked off.**

Everyone is required to wear a face mask to the church and to abide by the following rules in order to protect themselves and others:

1. A face mask must be worn at all times including entering and exiting the church and throughout the liturgy with the brief exception of removing it to receive communion;
 2. Sanitize your hands as soon as you enter the church;
 3. As you enter the church please occupy the front pews first;
 4. Refrain from singing throughout the liturgy;
 5. As you prepare to exit the church please exit starting with the rows that are closest to the entrances.
- Missals/Hymnals will not be available for use during Mass. Only the Cantor will be allowed to sing in order to prevent the spread of saliva particles.
 - There will neither be a solemn entrance procession nor a recessional by the celebrant and ministers.
 - No altar servers will be needed since gifts will be kept at the altar area.
 - The lectors will be seated at their designated seats prior to the Mass. There will be only one lector at each Mass.
 - There will not be a procession with the gifts at the preparation rite.
 - The collection baskets will be kept at the entrances of the church rather than passed during the Mass.
 - The sign of peace will be shared *without physical contact*.

Only two Eucharistic Ministers will be needed at each Mass. We encourage you to volunteer and serve as needed, after sanitizing your hands before and after the distribution of the Eucharist. If you wish to serve as EM please arrive at least 15 minutes before the Mass time and meet with the priest for instructions.

- The communion procession will be only in one line at each wing of the church and will be regulated by keeping the social distance. Communicants should come one row at a time beginning with the first row and return to their seats using the side aisles. Communion can be received only in the hand during Mass from the Priest or Eucharistic Minister who will gently drop the host in your hand. Please step away from the Priest or Eucharistic Minister to consume the Body of Christ by lifting your face mask and please refrain from stating "Amen".

At the Dismissal, the congregation is asked to exit the church row by row in an orderly manner so as to maintain safe distances and avoid unnecessary contact. When preparing to exit the church please start with those rows that are closest to the entrances.

The obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is still lifted by Bishop da Cunha, whose utmost concern is the health and wellbeing of our parishioners. Therefore, those who are feeling ill, or who have symptoms of fever, dry cough or sore throat should not come out to Mass but watch live streamed Mass from home.

- Every Sunday afternoon from 1:30PM -2:00PM Holy Communion will be distributed in the church for those who have joined the live stream Mass and those who would be at risk or are still justifiably uncomfortable being in the crowds for any length of time.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available on Saturdays from 3:00 to 3:45PM. Following the strict observance of social distancing it will be offered in the vestry at the main entrance of the church.

All other parish activities other than celebration of Masses will remain suspended at this time. The parish office remains closed to the public. Please call the office or email (ourladyofthecapebrewster@gmail.com) for any business related matters. Thank you !
