







Question: Why do Catholics call priests Father?

Answer: One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (23:19). It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes. In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31]) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus' teachings, he isn't saying that we can't use words like "father," "rabbi," or "master." Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to misuse them. To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church. The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need. **©LPi**

PUBLIC MASSES HAVE RESUMED

Following the guidelines given by Gov. Charlie Baker, the Most Reverend Edgar Da Cunha, Bishop of Fall River, announced reopening of churches to resume public Masses under strict guidelines.

- Out of an abundance of caution, Masses at Our Lady of the Cape church are scheduled for 4:00PM on Saturday s and Sundays at 10:00AM.
 Daily Mass will be celebrated at 8:00AM. Masses at Immaculate Conception Chapel are scheduled for Sundays at 9:30AM beginning June 14.
 The Saturday 4:00PM Mass and Sunday 10:00AM Mass will be live-streamed and archived on our parish website

 (www.ourladyofthecape.org) for you to access anytime. Daily Mass will be celebrated for the public and will be livestreamed at 8:00AM from Our Lady of the Cape church and archived on our parish website as well.
- We are returning to our worship place in a time when coronavirus is still a threat. As we get adjusted to this "new normal" we all should be extra prudent and prepared in observing all necessary precautions to avoid contracting the virus while participating in a large public gathering.
- Following the Governor's ordinance, at Our Lady of the Cape we can accommodate only 225 people at each service. The church has signage to direct people. The aisles and pews are marked to facilitate the observance of social distancing practices. Seating is on a first come first served basis. Not all pews of the church are open for seating. Every other pew is blocked off.

Everyone is required to wear a face mask to the church and to abide by the following rules in order to protect themselves and others:

- 1. A face mask must be worn at all times including entering and exiting the church and throughout the liturgy with the brief exception of removing it to receive communion;
- 2. Sanitize your hands as soon as you enter the church;
- 3. As you enter the church please occupy the front pews first;
- 4. Refrain from singing throughout the liturgy;
- 5. As you prepare to exit the church please exit starting with the rows that are closest to the entrances.
- Missals/Hymnals will not be available for use during Mass. Only the Cantor will be allowed to sing in order to prevent the spread of saliva droplets..
- There will neither be a solemn entrance procession nor a recessional by the celebrant and ministers.
- No altar servers will be needed since gifts will be kept at the altar area.
- The lectors will be seated at their designated seats prior to the Mass. There will be only one lector at each Mass.
- There will not be a procession with the gifts at the preparation rite.
- The collection baskets will be kept at the entrances of the church rather than passed during the Mass.
- The sign of peace will be shared without physical contact.
- The communion procession will be only in one line at each wing of the church and will be regulated by keeping the social distance. Communicants should come one row at a time beginning with the first row. Communion can be received only in the hand during Mass from the Priest or Eucharistic Minister who will gently drop the host in your hand. Please step six feet away from the Priest or Eucharistic Minister to consume the Body of Christ by lifting your face mask and please refrain from stating "Amen" and then walk down the side aisle to exit the church as directed. There is to be no returning to the pews.

The obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is still lifted by Bishop da Cunha, whose utmost concern is the health and wellbeing of our parishioners. Therefore, those who are feeling ill, or who have symptoms of fever, dry cough or sore throat should not come out to Mass but watch live streamed Mass from home.

- Every Sunday afternoon from 1:30PM -2:00PM Holy Communion will be distributed in the church for those who have joined the live stream Mass and those who would be at risk or are still justifiably uncomfortable being in the crowds for any length of time.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available on Saturdays from 3:00 to 3:45PM. Following the strict observance of social distancing it will be offered in the vestry at the main entrance of the church.

All other parish activities other than celebration of Masses and the Sacrament of Reconciliation will remain suspended at this time until further notice.
