## Memorial Bricks

Saint John the Baptist calls us to "Pave a Way" unto the Lord! The plaza in front of the new Our Lady of the Cape Church will be a place for parishioners to assemble and enter into the presence of the Lord. It will also be a gathering place



after Liturgies to renew and deepen friendships. The focus of the Plaza layout will be a dedication stone surrounded by Memorial Bricks. Each brick can be engraved with the name(s) of loved ones. This will be a lasting memorial -- a great testimony of love and faith for those we love and for ourselves.

Saint Paul speaks about stones building up the Body of Christ -- the Church. These memorial bricks will be symbolic of the people making up Christ's Body here at Our Lady of the Cape.

Each brick paver can have up to three lines of engraved characters (letters) with up to 15 characters per line. Spaces and punctuations count as a character. A sample memorial brick can be examined in the lobby of the Parish Center and at Immaculate Conception Chapel.

This is a great memorial for deceased persons as well as a way to honor individuals celebrating birthdays, anniversaries or the precious gift of friendship. Upon request, a certificate can be sent to individuals you so honor announcing your memorial gift.

Donation per brick: \$100. Proceeds to support the rebuilding of Our Lady of the Cape Church.

**Brick Inscription:** It is suggested that you inscribe only one or two names per brick for greater legibility. Please avoid using titles (i.e. Mr. & Mrs. John Doe). It is more personal to use first names (i.e. John & Jane Doe).


