



#### **GOV. VETOES NEARLY ALL OF EXPANDED ABORTION RULES**

We've been informed by Mass. Citizens for Life that Gov. Baker has indeed line-vetoed nearly all of section 40 of the state budget bill which would have widely expanded abortion rules in Massachusetts on a par with those of New York. The provisions would have approved late-term abortions up to birth, allowed doctors to kill/allow a baby born alive during an abortion to die, and would have removed all current legal penalties for violations of the law in regard to abortion---meaning abortionists could not be prosecuted for harming women.

The governor did retain a section of the law permitting abortions at or after 24 weeks in cases of so-called "fatal fetal abnormalities," even though that term is ambiguous and not defined in the bill and could lead to tragic, fatal errors.

However, Mass. Citizens for Life has thanked Gov. Baker for his near-complete veto as well as his commonsense recommendation to raise the age of consent to abortion to 18 years of age.

Many thanks to those of you who phoned the governor's office to express your opposition to the heinous provisions of Section 40. Your voices, and prayers, were heard!!

### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

What a joy to celebrate Christmas (albeit a bit differently than in past years) after our Advent period of anticipation. Since schools are closed for Christmas Break, Religious Education classes also take a break from in-person and video lessons. However, before we took our Holiday Break, we all enjoyed Father John Dolan treating each student with a special Christmas story time, with his own beautiful Christmas tree as backdrop. What a special and memorable way to celebrate Christmas!



**Question:** What is the difference between apostles and disciples

#### Answer:

When we look at the gospel accounts of the life of Jesus, we see two special titles applied to his followers: apostles and disciples. At first glance, we might think that these two words

are interchangeable, but when we look at what each one means, we quickly see that the evangelists were using them very specifically. When we look more closely, we see that while Jesus had many disciples, the group of apostles was much more limited and referred to Jesus' closest collaborators.

The word apostle essentially means "one who is sent forth" or, as we might think of it today, "an ambassador." The group of apostles — sometimes called the Twelve — included those twelve men who formed Jesus' inner circle (see Mark 3:13-14; Luke 6:12-13). It was this group that received the gift of the Holy Spirit and who were sent out by Jesus with the special mission of forgiving sins on that first Easter Sunday (see John 20:19 -23). In time, the Catholic Tradition also recognized Saint Paul and Saint Barnabas as apostles, recognizing that they also shared the mandate of going out in the Lord's name to pray, to bless, and to preach. In 2016, during the Jubilee of Mercy, Pope Francis raised the liturgical celebration of Saint Mary Magdalene to the rank of feast, recognizing that she also received a special mandate to proclaim the good news of Jesus' resurrection to the Eleven, becoming the "apostle to the apostles." In a particular way, the bishops continue the mission of the apostles in our own time.

When we think of the word disciple, we see that it has a very different meaning. Rather than referring to those who were sent out to carry on the mission of Jesus, disciple literally means "student" or, more specially, an "apprentice learner." The task of the disciple is to learn and integrate into their lives the teachings, values, and way of life of their master teacher. Although a disciple might be called on to explain or represent aspects of their life, in light of the teachings they receive from this master teacher, Christian discipleship is ultimately about living our lives with faith and integrity, guided by the life and mission of Jesus, our Master Teacher. The call to discipleship is the common vocation of all Christians.

### **GOSPEL MEDITATION** December 27, 2020 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. Their simple humble example is always before us, showing us the way. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!
